Giving men back to their families

Returning husbands to their wives, fathers to their children and sons to their parents is the work of the faith-based New Destiny Treatment Center (NDTC) program.

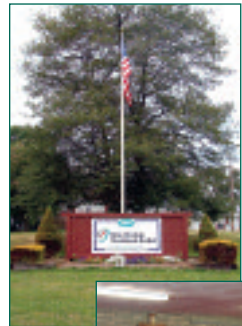


With God's help, lives are changed and families are reunited.

New Destiny Treatment Center helps to change men's lives by giving them the physical, emotional and spiritual tools to find God and overcome their dependencies. We revive their

God-given sense of responsibility. The beneficiaries are the clients, their families – and all of us.

NDTC uses biblical principles and modern treatment techniques to end dependency on alcohol and drugs.



At NDTC, chemically dependent clients receive a complete range of treatment services in a distinctly Christian environment.

Since 1993, this 65-bed facility (formerly known as the Barberton Rescue Mission) has provided an intense and well-structured nine-month residential treatment program.

Residential services

NDTC serves adult males between the ages of 18 and 60. Each day begins at 6:30 a.m. and ends at 10 p.m. Daily activities include classes in substance abuse education, 12-step recovery, spiritual formation, GED readiness, computer literacy and psychosocial education.



Other treatment services include group counseling, individual and family therapy, recreational activities, medical services, urinalysis drug screening and case management.



Prospective residential clients must:

- submit to a screening interview. (NDTC reserves the right to deny treatment based on

the evaluation of the individual).

- commit to nine months of treatment.
- agree to comply with all program rules and regulations.
- agree to conform to new behaviors and attitudes (e.g. no fighting, cursing, or substance use).



Community services

• DOT-certified physicals and drug testing

Physical exams, drug screenings and breath alcohol testing are available for



companies and organizations using drug-free workplace policies. These services meet federal Department of Transportation regulations.

• Outpatient treatment

This program, conducted Monday through Friday evenings, includes individual and group therapy, urine screenings and case management.

• Ambulatory Detoxification

Ambulatory detoxification (including opiate detox and maintenance) is available for clients who meet eligibility requirements.

• Anger management courses

A six-week (10 hour) anger management course is provided for both residential and outpatient clients.

Program costs

Residential treatment and community service costs can be obtained by calling the NDTC office at 330-825-5202. Prospective clients who are unable to pay for treatment may register for benefits through the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services.
